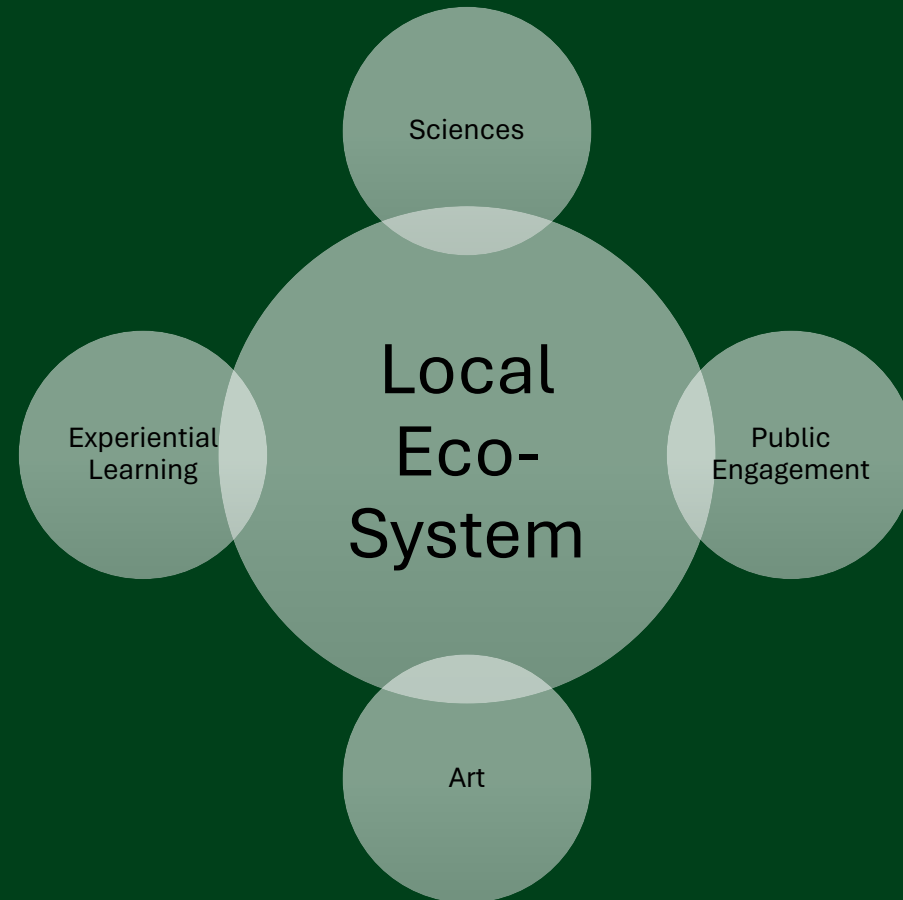
What does ecological conversion mean?

- Closely linked to eco-consciousness and the pursuit of ecological knowledge



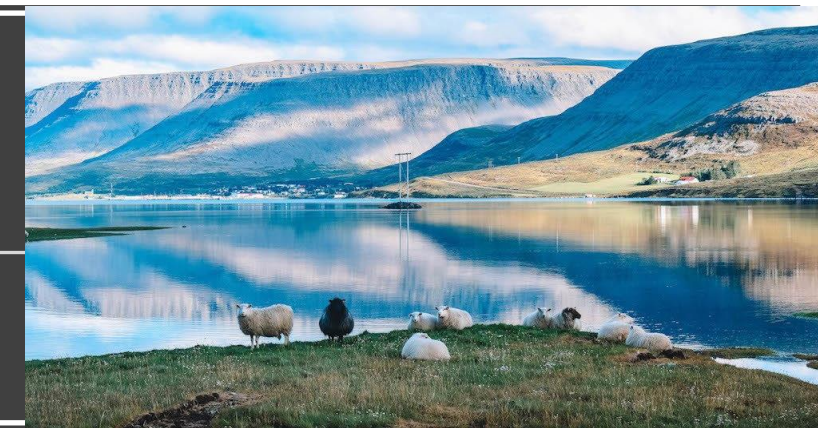
Leveraging Interdisciplinarity

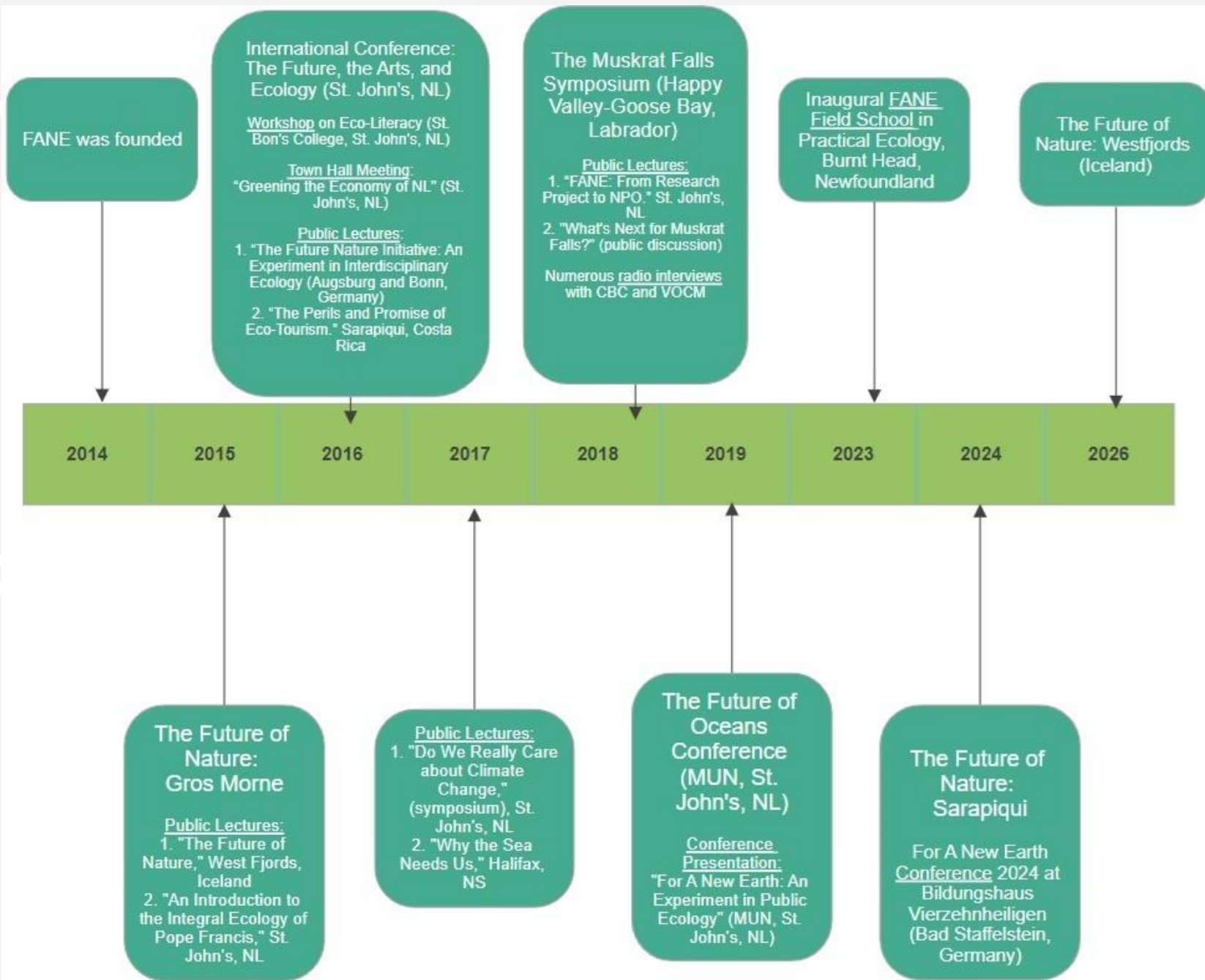
- Interdisciplinarity means breaking down barriers between academic disciplines and between academia and the general public

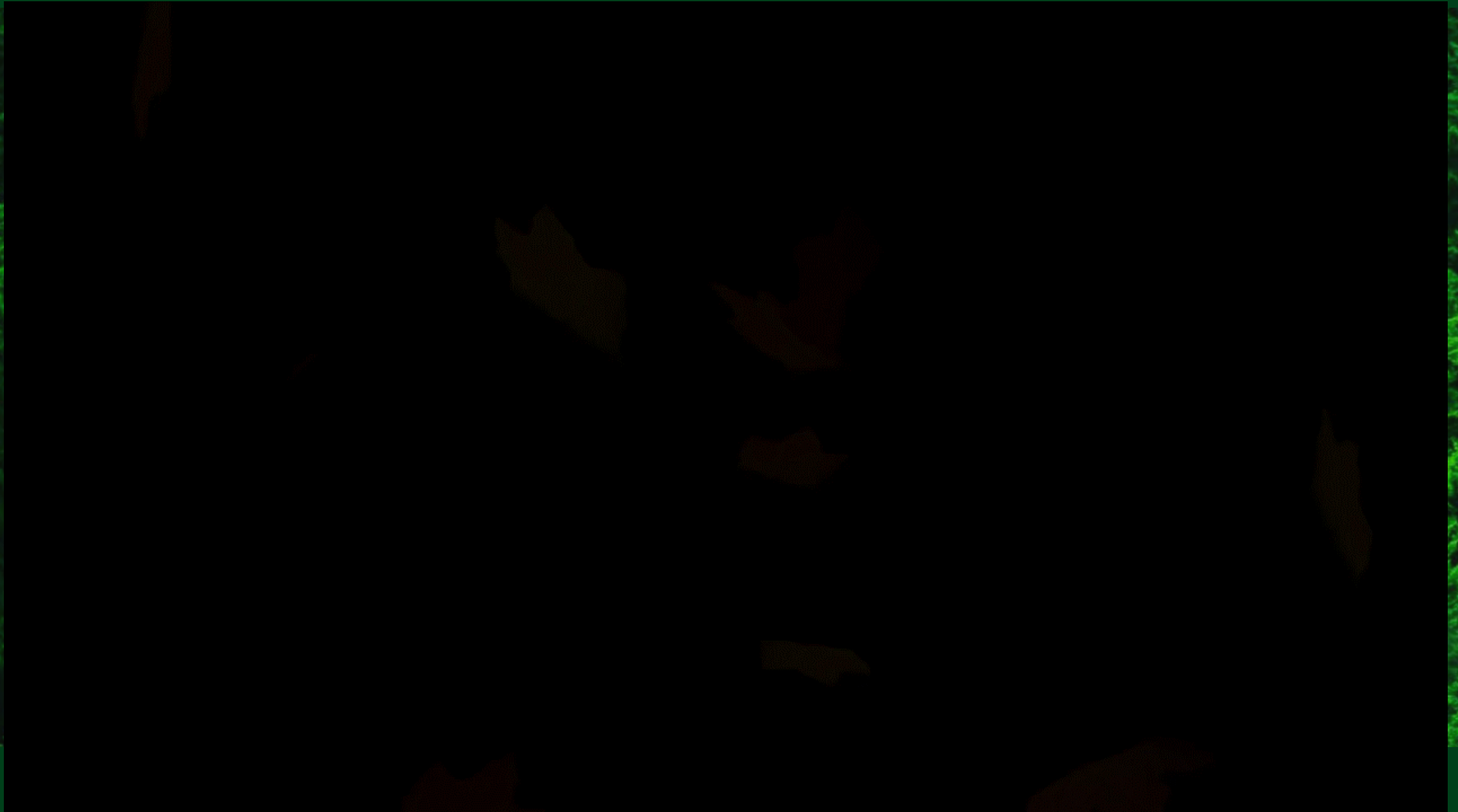

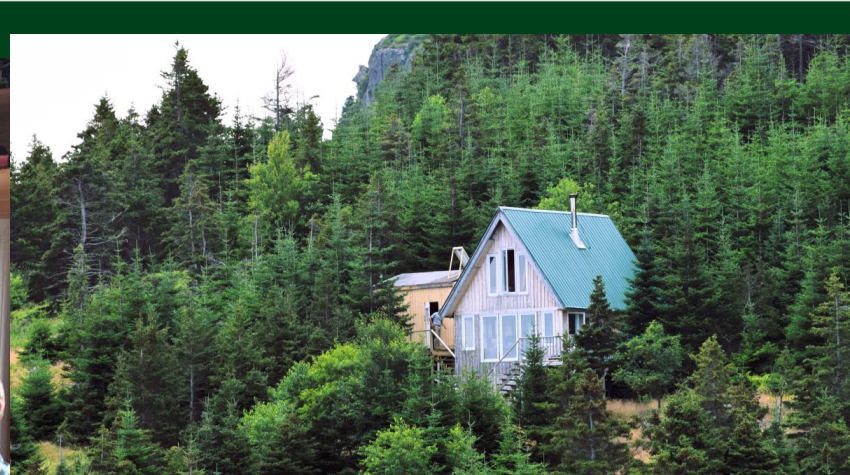

What else do we do besides „Future Nature Initiative“ events?

- Initiate dialogues on pressing ecological issues
- Plan interdisciplinary conferences and workshops
- Run the FANE “Field School” for practical ecology
- Publish blog posts and opinion pieces
- Record interviews and podcasts
- Communicate knowledge about climate change to the general public
- Participate in community events concerning ecology and climate change



What do we want for the future?

- Less ecological destruction
- A gradual transition to renewable energy and the divestment from fossil fuels
- Governments to uphold commitments to citizens (e.g., meeting climate change targets)
- Citizen engagement in local ecology and climate change
- Support for small-scale, sustainable industry (local farmers, low-impact eco-tourism providers, etc.).
- Climate and social justice
