### WHAT TO EXPECT FROM THE WORLD CAFE

- \* The Lawrence O'Brien Arts Centre will be set up with 7 round tables
- \* When you arrive, you will be assigned a colour, which will link you with a travelling group. Each group will start at a different table
- \* Each table has 2 Hosts, who will welcome you & start off the dialogue
